Behavioral Health

The Valley City Education Foundation received a \$6,124 Community Health Improvement Grant to implement the Access for All program, providing vital mental health services to over 50 students in grades K-12 within Valley City public schools, thereby addressing a critical need for accessible mental healthcare and fostering improved student well-being and academic success.

Workforce

Three graduating high school seniors pursuing healthcare careers received \$500 scholarships each, directly supporting their educational aspirations and contributing to the future healthcare workforce.

Access to Care

Five CPR/AED and Cardiac Readiness Trainings were conducted, reaching 36 community members and equipping them with life-saving skills, thereby enhancing community preparedness and potentially improving outcomes in cardiac emergencies.



Behavioral Health

Through a \$25,000 SPARK Grant, 34 individuals with concurrent housing instability and behavioral health challenges received financial assistance to support their health-related social needs and provided case management to 137 adolescents and young adults at high risk for violence. Plan to launch a hospital-based violence intervention program in 2025.
